Marilyn Ronoh participated in the Clinic on Meaningful Modelling of Epidemiological Data (MMED) held at the African Institute of Mathematical Sciences, South Africa, from 28th May to 8th June 2018. She gave a poster presentation of her work titled ''Impact of Comprehensive Knowledge of HIV/AIDS on Adolescents and Young Adults Disease Dynamics''. This Clinic further exposed her to Data Modelling and Agent Based Modelling methods which she intends to use in her PhD investigations and future research work.



Edinah Songoro attended the 7th International ICAN (Infection Control Africa Network) Congress in Cape Town, South Africa, from 8th to 11th July 2018." The conference emphasized on mother and child infections, antimicrobial resistance including the One Health approach, antimicrobial stewardship as well as healthcare-associated surveillance. Her main takeaway was that along with infection control, hand hygiene and surveillance is a key strategy in local and national programs to prevent the emergence of antimicrobial resistance.



Jacqueline Owigo attended the 14th Migration Summer School held at the European University Institute in Florence, Italy, from 25th June to 6th July 2018. The migration summer school offered her an opportunity to learn the latest trends in migration research as well as gain a deeper understanding of migration and how it affects governments and societies across the globe. She got the opportunity to present her research idea for discussion, and in return, she was able to gain useful feedback and suggestions from the participants.
